2010 Synod Assembly

Theme: "Mission globally. Mission locally."

Site for the Assembly has changed **AGAIN!**

- Weber Chapel is being renovated this summer, and we were originally relocated to the Field House. However, at Susquehanna University's suggestion, we have moved the location of this year's Assembly to the **Degenstein Center Theater in the Campus Center**, the same building where the dining hall is located.
- **Reasons for the change:**
 - Most events—except some workshops--will be in the Degenstein Campus Center. This will be far more convenient than having to travel from one end of the campus to the other as would have been necessary had we met in the Field House.
 - Seating will be more comfortable: cushioned theater seats with wide aisles and no folding chairs.
 - Parking will be easier. We will be able to park in the same lots where we parked for assemblies in the past (Weber and upper parking lots).
 - The sound equipment in the Degenstein Theater will be more effective than renting sound equipment capable of filling the large Field House without a stadium echo.
 - Rest rooms are more conveniently located.
- Registration for the Assembly will be in the theater lobby—not in tents. When approaching the Campus Center from the parking lot, use the main entrance on the right, which is the entrance specifically, designated for the Degenstein Theater. This entrance is depicted below.
- **Do not bring congregational banners** this year!



Degenstein Theater can be accessed from the parking lot through the entrance depicted at left.

(This is at the opposite side of the building from where most have entered the dining hall in previous years.)

Things to know about the Degenstein Theater:

1. **Most but not all voting members will be able to sit in the lower level of the theater.**
2. **The theater is considerably smaller and more intimate than Weber Chapel.**
3. **The theater is tiered. Wide steps will need to be navigated. Ushers will be available. The steps are not especially difficult.**
4. **Persons with height-related fears may want to avoid the balcony.**
5. **Accommodation is available for wheelchair access.**
