NEWS FROM WOMEN OF THE ELCA CHURCHWIDE

Wow! A lot has transpired since our last Share. As I write this, the mask ban has just been lifted for those with vaccines. Things are starting to get back to normal. But it has been anything but normal these past many months and our women have adapted. We have seen units offer virtual Bible studies, meetings and "how to" sessions like learning to quilt blankets for babies and making lap robes for the homebound.

Some of our synods sponsored virtual Thank Offering services as well as virtual Bible studies, meetings and hymn sings.

Churchwide has and continues to offer Gather Magazine Bible Studies with the author offering additional insights on-line, a once a month Cafe BYOD(bring your own dinner) study with a variety of women and great discussion of various topics. We continue to offer Daily Grace (a free online devotion for women) or pray with hundreds of women across the country each Tuesday at noon(there is a downloadable page that shares a Bible verse and suggestions/ideas on various needs to pray about on our website).

Those are just a few offerings happening over the past year from Units, Synods and Churchwide. It's been a tough year and a half, but we have coped, changed and even flourished. We have all learned new things - from asking What is Zoom? to using it on a regular basis. However, many of us are looking forward to actually sitting down with a cup of coffee and talking face to face.

Yes, we have had a lot of changes thrown at us this year and a half. That is true for churchwide as well. I've been on the Ex. Bd for 7 years - a term is 3 years and I have been blessed to be elected by Women across the country twice. However because of the pandemic we were all asked to stay on another year until a new board could be elected in Aug 2021 during our triennial convention.

Our convention was to take place in Phoenix last year, however, it was postponed and because of the pandemic continuing earlier this year, the board decided to go virtual for our triennial convention. The schedule will look a lot different than being there in person. There will be no Gathering as in past years because of everything being on line. However, I do have good news to report,

that in 2023 we will be in Phoenix AZ in September for the Triennial and Gathering(which should be cooler for those concerned about being there in July/Aug.).

If you haven't heard already, our churchwide staffing has gone down considerably - we now have 2 full time staffers and as of this writing 6 part time. In Sept. we may have 2 full-time staff with one part-time. We had to cut-back due to offerings being down. The pandemic certainly was a big factor, but giving has been down for a number of years and we had to get realistic with the amount of funds coming in and going out. The two full time employees are Linda Bushkowski, the Ex. Director and Elizabeth Hunter, Gather Magazine Editor. We hope that we will be able to up the staffing again, but for now, it is what it is.

The ministry has NOT CHANGED. Our mission statement is still relevant and our mission is the same, it's just that we have to do things somewhat differently than in the past. We've all found that out over the past 1 1/2 years, but we are still doing ministry in Christ's name and that is what counts. I hope and pray that our financial situation turns around so more ministry can be done to help women and children in our communities, nationally and internationally on a larger scale as we've done in past years. However, we are thankful for each of you and your commitment to Women of the ELCA.

On a bright note: Cafe and Gather Magazine won 15 awards from Religion Communicators Council and Associated Church Press in 2021. As a member of the Churchwide Executive Board I want to thank each of you for your

commitment, dedication and love of Women of the ELCA organization. We are stronger together. I look forward to seeing all of you in Sept. at our convention. I look forward to having a cup of coffee and catching up in person.

"ECCLESIASTICAL" Balloting Made Simple ...

First, let's consider <u>what is an "Ecclesiastical" Ballot.</u> It is a Spirit-led method for electing the President and Vice President of the Synodical Women's Organization ... delegates write on their first ballots the name of the person each delegate thinks would best fulfill the office, even without obtaining prior consent from that nominee. (NOTE: The Committee on Nominations does <u>not</u> present nominees for the offices of President and Vice President.)


First Ballot – This is the <u>nominating</u> ballot, with all names and number of votes received to be reported ... three-fourths of the votes cast shall be required for election on the first ballot. If there is no election, time is given for the nominees to consider whether or not they wish to be nominees. If they decline, their names are withdrawn.

Second Ballot – All remaining names are listed ... two-thirds of the votes cast shall be required for election.

Third Ballot – The two persons (plus ties) receiving the highest number of votes on the second ballot are listed ... a majority of votes shall elect.

NOTE: Delegates to the September 25th USSWO Convention are to be made aware that there will be elections for President and Vice President that day, using the Ecclesiastical Ballot.

While we did not meet, nor had a Convention last year, you continued to faithfully send your Regular Offerings. I did receive some Ingathering Offerings throughout the year. Gifts received--\$320.00. I forwarded this to the "Lutheran Disaster Response."

At the 2021 Convention the **Ingathering Offering** will again be for the "Lutheran Disaster Response." The **In-kind Offering** will be for Haven Ministries (a Homeless Shelter) in Sunbury and the New Love Center (a Food Pantry) in Jersey Shore.

In June 2001, Vicar Jodi entered the Authorized Lay Worship Leader program, as part of only the second class to be held. She received her Authorization in June 2003 and has served throughout the Upper Susquehanna Synod within that position.

In September 1999, she began a seventeen-year career at Millersburg Area School District, serving as Middle School/High School Family Consumer Sciences Teacher. During her tenure with the School District, she served as Middle School Student Council Advisor, being awarded the Pennsylvania Association of Student Council Advisor's District 8 Advisor of the Year award for the year 2013. In 2016, her position ended as the School District curtailed their Family and Consumer Science program. Since that time she serves as an Associate Trainer in the Revenue Management Training Department for Geisinger Health Systems.

When she accepted the position at Millersburg School District, it was in conversation with God that she said, "I guess I will be here until it's time to go to seminary." As her position ended at Millersburg, she was reminded of that conversation through multiple sources telling her it was now time to do what she was supposed to do.

Churchwide News & Notes

Deacon Sandy Grier-Member of the Churchwide Executive Board

I was asked to share why we give to Women of the ELCA and where the money goes. Well, you go to a Women of the ELCA meeting in your unit (church) and donate money.

Half of that money is used within your congregation and local community, such as: funeral luncheons, quilting supplies, local food pantries, etc. The other half of that money goes to the Synodical Women of the ELCA. The officers and executive board determine where the money is spent that is received ... such as keeping the cost at a minimum for our Synod's Women's Convention held at Camp Mt. Luther each year, sponsoring programs throughout the year such as Day of Learning/Renewal and the annual Women's Retreat at Mt. Luther. There is also an expense in getting the quilts shipped following Blanket Sunday each year and also printing and mailing SHARE, our synodical newsletter. Half of the money sent to our Synod's Women of the ELCA is sent to Chicago to Women of the ELCA Churchwide. That money is used for weekend meetings/workshops/discussions with all the Synodical Presidents of Women of the ELCA (expenses such as travel, housing and meals), Treasurer training, support programs/workshops/retreats that have been created and are downloadable for free to you, the congregational units. Expenses for travel to conventions are also covered for churchwide reps who represent Lisa Plorin, our Women of the ELCA president, and your dollars also support Lutheran women for their continuing education in the US; staffing—including Linda Post-Bushkowski, our Executive Director in Chicago—who is a wealth of information; also our diversity coordinator as well as our publicity/education staff members who produce our award-winning magazines/blogs/Facebook pages/pinterest/etc.

The money you donate also supports our mandated Triennial Convention which, in 2023, is in Phoenix AZ. Each president of Women of the ELCA in our 64 synods, as well as additional voting members elected at each synodical women's convention (your representatives) will have their transportation, lodging and meals paid for through your generous giving.

We also provide educational opportunities for women and children throughout the world through Katie's Fund and we are a leading force in education about, and awareness of, human trafficking.

PACKING INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Choose boxes that can be easily carried by one person. PREFERRED boxes can be requested from the dairy section of your local grocery store. Eggs are crated in boxes that have hand-holds at both ends of each box and can be easily carried. They hold a great deal of material, can be stacked easily, and fit into cars and trucks easily. If you cannot carry the box, it is likely that our movers cannot carry it either.
- 2. Boxes must have solid lids.
- 3. Sort and pack each kind of item in separate boxes. PLEASE DO NOT MIX SEVERAL THINGS IN THE SAME BOX. Please label boxes accordingly or place a bar code label on the top and cover with clear tape.
- 4. Boxes are not to weigh more than 40 pounds.
- 5. Tape boxes securely with packing tape. This holds the lid on and reinforces the boxes.
- 6. Mark boxes "LWR" and list the general contents (i.e. "personal care kits," "school kits," "soap," "quilts," etc.) on the outside with a marking pen.

You can expect that each box will be handled and stacked and moved several times, just like it moves through a post office. It can be dropped, pushed, heaved, lifted, and stacked numerous times by numerous people – from your church to New Windsor Processing Center and Warehouse. Your care in packing and labeling is greatly appreciated!

To finish the job:

Complete the form on reverse side and take with you when you deliver your boxes to the collection point. If you take donations directly to New Windsor, mail this form to the address on the reverse side.

Deliver to the collection point during the hours specified.
