From Bishop Craig Miller

Among the many things on my mind as we enter the season of Lent, a few bear mentioning in this brief column. The first is the Camp Mount Luther Capital Campaign, which seeks to improve facilities for campers and others who use this



wonderful place. I am excited to see this project break ground because of the generosity of this synod, our congregations, and members.

Much of our time and energy in the synod office goes into looking for ways to provide leadership and assistance to our 115 congregations. Our approximately sixty active pastors, including those who are retired but still serve as interims and Sunday supply, are being asked to take on ever-increasing burdens, and I can sense their fatigue and, sometimes, discouragement. I have tasked our Lay Ministry Institute with developing training for our congregation leaders that, along with our robust Lay Worship Leaders program, will help to alleviate the burden on our pastors so that they can focus on the mission for which God called them.

Finally, with plans for our 2024 Synod Assembly well underway, I anticipate an exciting and informative event June 14-15. This year, we will begin with a morning of workshops, fellowship, and refreshments in the Degenstein Center. Following lunch, we will begin the business of the assembly. Visitors are encouraged to attend the workshops and stay to observe the meeting, then return to congregations and share what you have seen and heard.
