Focus on...

Ansbach-Würzburg Kirchenkreis



The Upper Susquehanna Synod maintains two global companion synod relationships, including the Ansbach-Würzburg Kirchenkreis (Bavaria, Germany) and the Lutheran Church in Liberia. The Ansbach-Würzburg

Kirchenkreis (AWK) traces its roots back over 500 years to the Protestant Reformation and Martin Luther. While the Upper Susquehanna Synod's (USS) relationship with AWK began much later (in December of 1996) we share a common theological and cultural ancestry. In 2001 the first official partnership agreement was signed by then Bishop Bezzel and Bishop A. Donald Main at the Bishop's Retreat in Wellsboro. The partnership has since been renewed multiple times, most recently at the 2022 Synod Assembly. This relationship has led to several youth and choir exchanges as well as multiple visits of USS and AWK representatives to each other's territories.

At its February meeting, the ELCA Conference of Bishops issued a statement calling for a bilateral cease-fire in Gaza.

(https://www.elca.org/News-and-<u>Events/8217</u>). This statement, and a letter to President Biden (https://tinyurl.com/y7h5s8v9) asks our government to take a strong role in bringing about a peaceful resolution to the current situation and to recognize the value of Palestinian and Israeli lives.

I have sent a letter to each of the Congressional Representatives whose districts intersect with our Upper Susquehanna Synod, asking them to embrace this statement and exert their influence by calling for a cease-fire.

I encourage you to take a moment and communicate your own thoughts to your representatives as well as to President Biden. You may include the Conference of Bishops statement or craft your own. You can find your representatives at this link:
