Global Health Ministries (GHM) focuses on strengthening health systems through access to medical equipment and supplies, support for community-based primary health care programs, and expert administrative and leadership consulting.

They've partnered for decades in resource-poor settings and these deep relationships are one of our core competencies. They journey together with our brothers and sisters in Christ, where Lutheran churches manage hospitals, clinics, and grassroots efforts - all focused on improving the health of even the most vulnerable.

GHM focuses on strengthening health systems through three integrated strategies: Leadership, Medical Supplies, and Grassroots Efforts.

Annual Assembly Soon

The Upper Susquehanna Synod Assembly will convene on June 14 & 15 2024, in Weber Chapel, Susquehanna University, Selinsgrove, under the theme "Fed by Jesus to feed the world." At this assembly we will also elect synod council members and voting members to the 2025 Churchwide Assembly and conduct other synod business. Prior to the assembly, on Friday morning, workshops will be offered on various topics. The agenda will include Bible Study led by the Rev. Dr. Lisa Barnes, Pastor of the Follmer Parish. The Camp Mount Luther Staff will lead devotions on Friday and will be installed. Our ELCA Representative will be Marie Ann Sliwinski, Senior Director, ELCA Building Resilient Communities. Visitors are welcome at this assembly, especially for the workshops. Updates during assembly will be posted on the synod Facebook page. A full report will appear in the next USS Ark. From Bishop Craig Miller

"[The Church] is the assembly of all believers among whom the gospel is purely preached, and the holy sacraments are administered according to the gospel." (Augsburg Confession VII)

The New Testament word "ekklesia", usually translated "church", means "assembly". Thus, we understand ourselves to be church when we gather in assembly. Most frequently, we assemble on Sunday in our separate congregations (synonymous with assemblies) where we hear the gospel preached and share in the sacraments of the church.

Even as we gather in separate communities, we understand that the Church is more than our local gathering: we are part of the "communion of saints" across time and space who also gather. We pray in our communion liturgy "with the church on earth and the church in heaven, we praise [God's] name and join [the Church's] unending hymn."

The ELCA calls itself a church with three expressions, congregations, synods, and the churchwide organization, each of which, separately and together, are most fully known in assembly, gathering around the Word and Sacraments where Christ gives himself to us. In our assemblies, we strive to manifest the unity of our faith in Jesus Christ as we faithfully carry out Christ's mission.

Our synod will assemble on June 14-15. We will center our work around the gospel, even as we vote on matters of governance and administration. Through worship, prayer, and study, the gospel will be proclaimed, and we will be fed on Christ's body and blood.

I ask you to pray for our church in all its expressions, especially for those who will assemble in June, that we will be a sign of God's love in Jesus Christ coming into the world, a representation of the assembly of all believers.
